Artists studios abound in Naples where craftsmen construct their famous creches, or nativity scenes. Sculptor, Lello Esposito, talks about Pulcinello which is a Neapolitan symbol and stereotype. We hear a poem dedicated to soccer star, Diego Maradona, and visit the bustling fish market. Learn360

### Popular Music

7:19 min H 2009

The central plaza may host horse events or wedding photos. We visit the Cathedral where a beatification ceremony takes place and witness the fervor surrounding the annual miracle of San Genaro. Music is important in Naples and the Naples' Conservatory prepares students. We see the workshop of luthiers as they make violins and the typical Neapolitan mandolin. Serenades are heard in the city streets. Learn360

### Sorrento

The coastline and Sorrento are known for their beauty and music. Enrico Caruso is remembered at the Gran Hotel Excelsior Vittorio where he stayed in Sorrento. We see a traditional Tamburiata dance and hear about the refined regional cuisine. Learn360

### Aerial Acrobats And The Giulian Alps

The Italian National Aerobatic Team, the Frece Tricolori, with nine aircraft in formations and one soloist, are based in Friuli Venezia Giulia. The Giulian Alps border Austria, Slovenia and Italy, and mountain climbers also enjoy the Alpine meadows and lakes. Skiing at Tavisiano, site of the Winter Olympics, and windsurfing on the lakes provide year round sport. Learn360

### The Carnia Highlands

7:59 min H 2009  
Shepherds in the Carnia highlands pasture their cattle and make herb flavored cheeses in the old tradition. In Sauris one can note the strong German and Tirolian identity in the music, architecture, crafts and smoked hams. At Arta Terme horseback riding and tourism are encouraged. The cuisine of Carnia is displayed and explained. Learn360

### Gorizia, Grappa Distillery And Gold Sands

7:34 min H 2009  
In the medieval town of Gorizia we hear the international Coro Polifonico di Ruda. Nearer the sea, Venice built Gradisca and the fortified Palmanova, in a polygonal layout of a nine pointed star, as eastern bastions. Distillery owners explain how they produce their famous Grappa. The golden sands of the coastline and long beaches of Lignano Sabbiadoro became a famous tourist spot in the 1950's. Learn360

### Montefalcone Shipyards / Miramar Castle

6:19 min H 2009  
Every July a parade of boats carries the statue of the Madonna across the lagoon from Grado. At Redipuglia a military chapel and war memorial commemorate the dead. Modern cruise ships are constructed at the Montefalcone shipyards. The Rilke Paths that overlook the Gulf of Trieste from Duino remind us of the

poet's Elegies. The Castle of Miramar built for the Hapsburg Archduke Maximilian is filled with reminders of the sea. Learn360

### Quake Damaged Cities Rebuilt

4:23 min H 2009  
In the 15th century center of the capitol of Carnia, Tolmezzo, we visit a local museum. At Bordano we see the House of Butterflies which maintains in controlled environments over 500 species from around the world. After a devastating earthquake in 1976, cities and towns were rebuilt with incredible fidelity to the originals, like the Renaissance walled city Venzone. Learn360

### Roman Aquileia And The Marano Lagune

4:48 min H 2009  
The Marano Lagoon provides shellfish to the region and is an eco reserve where bird watching and environmental tourism are encouraged. The Roman crossroads town of Aquileia is declared a World Heritage Site for its archeological ruins. The island of Grado is a spa resort known as the Pearl of the Adriatic. Fish is important in the cuisine and we see the preparation of Bolleto, a local dish. Learn360

### San Daniele And Udine

7:26 min H 2009  
A fifteenth century Guarnieri Library preserves ancient codexes. The medieval city of San Daniele is known for its 18th century palaces and its famous prosciutto, cured hams that go well with Friuli wine. Cividale del Friuli was an important seat for the Roman Empire and, later, the Lombards. Udine was ruled by the Venice and influenced by Venetian style. The region is known for its vineyards and varietal wines. Learn360

### Trieste

6:22 min H 2009  
The historic city of Trieste is a city of diverse population and cultural wealth, visited often by writers like James Joyce. Trieste's Festival of the Sea is the world's largest open regatta. Learn360

### Magnificent Italia: LAZIO

A synthesis of history, art and culture is concentrated in Rome, the Eternal City. As we walk through its streets, every corner evokes memories of its extraordinary past, and we cannot help but marvel at the magnitude of this once queen of the world, and her surrounding mountains, villas and castles.

### Along The Tiber

6:13 min H 2009  
In the Tiber River, Isola Tiberina was an isolation colony during plague epidemics. Trastevere is a popular quarter and entertainment district. We see the Campo dei Fiori markets and Piazza Farnese with its Spanish Steps. A craftsman explains his dedication to the restoration of porcelain dolls. Learn360

### Along The Tyrrhenian Coast

7:29 min H 2009  
The Torre Astura watch tower and Castel Nettuno once protected the coast and we see the Anzio beach and military cemeteries that commemorate the failed allied landing of WWII. The sculptures of Manzu are celebrated in the Ardea Museum. At Ostia, excavations and restoration continue unearthing the ruins of the ancient Roman city at the mouth of the Tiber. Learn360

### Castel S'Angelo/ Villa Borghese/ Sports

5:53 min H 2009  
The round Castel S'Angelo has been a fortress and Papal residence guarded by angel sculptures along its bridge. The bio-park in the heart of the city, Villa Borghese, is a mixture of art and nature. The Olympic Stadium was built in the 1930's and hosted the 1990 World Cup. A vast tennis complex has hosted the Rome Tennis Internationals. Learn360

### The Castelli Romani Area

9:41 min H 2009  
At Frascati we visit the celebrated wine cellars. The Monastery of San Milo in Grottaferrata maintained the Byzantine Rites, blending the Eastern and Western Church. Above Lake Albano, Castel Gandolfo was the Papal holiday residence. In Ariccia, the Palazzo Chigi with its 17th century furnishings and artwork is an example of Roman Baroque. Along the Via Appia Antica at Genzano, bakers prepare a specialty bread. Learn360

### Central Montemartini/ Vatican City

11:19 min H 2009  
Fiumicino and Campino airports handle the growing volume of visitors to Rome. The Roma EUR, area of urban renewal, and the artistic and industrialist architecture blended at the Centrale Montemartini Power Station where statues of Greek Gods stand amid the turbines demonstrate the marriage of old and new. We see the ruins on Palatine Hill and the Vatican City where the ceremony of the Swiss Guards takes place in St. Peter's Square. A last aerial view over Rome affords the viewer a reminder of the 2700 year history of the Eternal City. Learn360

### Roman Forum/ Piazza del Campidoglio

5:23 min H 2009  
Rome is a modern city that preserves its ancient past, expanding with archeological digs the Roman Forum seen here in aerial views. We see statues and classical artwork in the Musei Capitolini, the Piazza del Campidoglio by Michelangelo and the medieval church Santa Maria in Ara Coeli. Learn360

### Tivoli / Hadrian's Villa

6:39 min H 2009  
The modern Arco della Musica Auditorium is the venue for performing arts. On the road toward Abruzzo we visit Tivoli and the Villa D'Este declared a World Heritage Site for its Renaissance garden design and fountains. At Hadrian's

### Magnificent Italia: LIGURIA

Along Italy's northwest coast, travel in the footsteps of the locals down the narrow streets of these quaint seaside towns. From secluded romantic bays, to urban landscapes, the sea is a constant reminder of the famous navigators that have made call to the region.

### Bay Of La Spezia

9:15 min H 2009

Four thousand year old sandstone statues predate the Roman town of Luni, now known as La Spezia which is the largest port in Italy. The underwater park near Telaro and the town of Lerici are among the seaside villages on the Bay of La Spezia, called the Bay of Poets. The port complex is home to the ship-building Arsenal and the Naval Museum. Learn360

### Bay of Tigullio / Zoagli And

#### Rapallo

8:37 min H 2009

From Levanto and Sesteri Levante, we see the peninsula of Parco dei Castelli where Marconi carried out radio experiments. The local cuisine, Bagnun, combines anchovies and tomatoes. Around the Bay of Tigullio, we visit Zoagli, famous for its hand loomed silk damasks, and Rapallo's cableway up to the Madonna di Montealegre. The Bay of Tigullio hosts international regattas. Learn360

### Camogli / Watersports / Nervi

8:15 min H 2009

Camogli is an unusual village of sailors known for an enormous pan for frying fish and for the colorful houses that line the coast where wives waited for their seafaring men. Watersports training takes place in Sori and Bagliasco and is popular throughout the coastal region. Art nouveau restaurants line the rocky coastal strip of Nervi, backed by natural parks and villas. Art of the region is featured in the museum. Learn360

### Cinque Terre

5:35 min H 2009

The five towns of Cinque Terre, Riomaggiore, Manarola, Vernazza, Corniglia and Monterossa, nestle in crevices of the steep coastal cliffs which are terraced with vineyards and cultivated paths. Monorails facilitate movement up and down the terraced vineyards. The President of the Cinque Terre National Park explains the unique topography and agriculture of the region. Learn360

### Genoa

7:15 min H 2009

Passing Quarto dei Mille where Garibaldi launched the struggle for Italian unification, we arrive at Genoa, port of commerce and cultural destination. In the Porto Antico we see the modern Genoa Aquarium dedicated to environmental conservation. The Vigo revolving crane

gives a scenic view of the city. Christopher Columbus and Marco Polo are honored in the Palazzo San Giorgio and the Seat of the City Council in the historic center. Cultural events take place in the Ducal Palace. Learn360

### Portofino / Bay Of San Fruttuoso

6:19 min H 2009

The jetsetters may not be aware of Portofino's Roman origins as it is known more for fashion and sailing, like the Zegna Trophy regatta. At a marine reserve divers can admire the underwater statue of Cristo degli Abissi. The Tower of Andria Doria and the Abbey can be seen from the Bay of San Fruttuoso. Learn360

### World Heritage Palaces

8:30 min H 2009

In San Pietro dei Banchi, where medieval bankers plied their trade, the Cathedral San Lorenzo harbors treasures and relics. Two national galleries display the art of Genovese painters. The 16th and 17th century palaces of the Dorias and the later Savoys are UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The collection in the Tassio Music Shop honors the influence of Fabbrizio di Andrea on Italian song. Learn360

### Magnificent Italia: MARCHE

L113925, DO

Lining the Adriatic coast, long sandy beaches and rocky promontories combine to create a dramatic landscape. Immerse yourself in the silence of ancient monasteries, the bustling seaports, and the age-old traditions of the interior towns. Discover the artistic heritage worthy of great cities of art.

### Accordions / The Shrine of Loreto

6:23 min H 2009

Inland we visit Castelfidardo where Francesca Pigni explains the precise and laborious production of their world famous accordions. Loreto sprang into existence in 1294 with the Shrine of Loreto where pilgrims venerate the Holy House, believed to be the house of Mary of Nazareth, transported by angels. The church is filled with frescoes and statues that recount the legend. Learn360

### Ancona

4:42 min H 2009

The natural harbor of Ancona is now an international shipyard known for its beautifully designed yachts. The regional capital, Ancona, is also a city of history and culture with its cisterns and fountains, piazzas and churches. The Cathedral is perched high above the city where the Acropolis of Ancona's Greek founders once stood and combines Eastern and Gothic styles of different epochs. Learn360

### Historic Towns: Osimo And Jesi

6:27 min H 2009

Osimo's Roman past is evident in the stones of its walls and the statues, now headless, that were once in the Roman forum. The Duomo, from the eleventh century, rises above a pagan temple. A winemaker recounts how the verdicchio wines of the region are updated

for modern tastes. Jesi, the birthplace of Emperor Frederick II, displays its cultural history, and in Palazzo Pianetti one can admire the art of Lorenzo Lotto. Learn360

### Monte Conero And The Due Sorelle

4:42 min H 2009

Mountain climber, Francesco Burratini, talks about climbing the sheer cliff face of Monte Conero that rises sharply above the Due Sorelle beaches. Settlements are perched on cliff tops while watch towers and a Romanesque Benedictine Monastery hug the coast. Learn360

### Paper And Watermark / Frasassi Caves

5:17 min H 2009

Fabriano was the birthplace of European paper production where we see the ancient methods of pulping and sieving at the Museum of Paper and Watermark. At Frasassi we see the primary medieval settlement of the Benedictines and the famous Frasassi show caves, Grotte di Frasassi. The forty castles of Arcevia and the fortified town of Piticchio recall the conflicts between the Sforza and Malatesta families. Learn360

### Pergola Bronzes, Urbania

#### Mayolica

6:43 min H 2009

The gilded bronze statues of Pergola are examples of Roman art while the painted wooden statues are from the 15 and 16th centuries. Urbania is known for its ceramics and mayolica. We see the workshops of mayolica craftsmen. A farm restaurant takes advantage of local produce. Learn360

### Pesaro Opera Festival

7:10 min H 2009

In the mountainous area of Montefeltro, castles and fortresses arise like those of Sassocorvaro and San Leo, and villages dot the Appenine region. The Rossini Opera Festival is celebrated in the composer's birthplace, Pesaro. In a descent to the sea, we see Gradara and the beach town of Gabicce Mare with its modern high rises. Learn360

### Senigallia Cuisine

8:09 min H 2009

We see the medieval town of Ostra Vetere and the canal port of Senigallia where chef Mauro Uliassi talks about the cuisine of Le Marche. The earthquake damaged Church of San Francesco houses the tombs of the Malatesta family. Fano is mentioned in Cesar's accounts and is known as a city of art where young Raphael and Perugino practiced their craft. Learn360

### Urbino

5:15 min H 2009

The Ducal Palace of Urbino is the symbol of Italian Renaissance architecture, built for the Montefeltro family. Urbino's museum contains a collection of Italian art from the middle ages to the Renaissance, such as Piero della Francesca's Ideal City. Urbino's historic center has

### Magnificent Italia: PUGLIA

Puglia is a region with many fascinating landscapes, from the Adriatic coast to the interior, from the wild nature of the islands to the vast plains broken by calcareous rocks. Traverse through the tiny fishing villages that dot the coast, to the most famous sanctuaries of Southern Italy amid productive farms and legendary castles.

### Altamura / Gravina

7:01 min H 2009

The Pulo di Altamura is the largest of the deep depressions in the plateau where prehistoric people inhabited caves. Altamura is famous for its olive oil and bread. We visit an Altamura bakery. The castle, cathedral and city walls of Santa Chiara were built by Frederick II. We see the wheat fields of the Murguia landscape, the Norman Cathedral and craftsmen making terracotta whistles in Gravina, and the caves where a medieval cave civilization carved houses and shrines. Learn360

### Bari

7:39 min H 2009

The capital city, Bari, was important in Roman times and for its medieval pilgrimages to the Shrine of Saint Nicola, often known as Santa Claus. The Norman domination and influence of Frederick II is evident in the Cathedral which also retains its Greek Orthodox heritage. Modern economic growth makes Bari the second most important city of Italy. Learn360

### Caves of Castellana/ Puglia Farm Hotels

3:58 min H 2009

Puglia is riddled with potholes and ravines and the Caves of Castellana are famous. Marchione Castle, once a hunting lodge, now hosts banquets and events. The Puglia farming culture is represented by the hospitality of the farm hotels offering traditional cuisine. Along the sea coast with its beaches and caves, we see the town of Polignano, built on the rocks abutting the sea. Learn360

### Monte Sant'Angelo

6:04 min H 2009

Isolated villages dot the mountain massif of the Gargano Promontory leading up to the town of Monte Sant'Angelo with its castle and Shrine of St. Michael where pilgrimages were made during the Crusades. We visit the Sanctuary of St. Michael's which descends to the Grotto. The extensive salt works of Margherita di Savoia is still in production and is a natural park for migrating birds. Learn360

### Shrine Of Padre Pio/ Barletta

7:37 min H 2009

At San Giovanni Rotondo the shrine of Padre Pio, canonized in 2002, is seen with its modern, shell-like architecture, sculptures and reed organ. We see the Roman ruins of Lucera and its Cathedral built upon a thirteenth century mosque of

the Saracenes who were resettled there. At the maritime crossroads of Barletta, the Castle shows evidence of its various conquerors. The Castel del Monte designed by Frederick II is protected by Unesco and its use remains an enigma. We see the restored Greek Orthodox Church of Santa Maria degli Angeli. Learn360

### Trani / Molfetta Fishing Port

6:19 min H 2009

The countryside above the Trani coast is patterned with vineyards and olive groves. We visit an olive oil producer and the Romansque Cathedral of Trani with its rose windows and bronze doors. At the port of Molfetta, amid medieval palaces and Romanesque churches, we visit the important fish market and hear buyers shout out orders as the fleet comes in. Learn360

### Tremiti Archipelago/ Trabucchi Fishing

9:54 min H 2009

A natural Marine Reserve is found among the islands off Puglia's Gargano Promontory. A finger of land divides the sea from Lake Lesina where fishing spots for the famous Lesina eels are portioned out each year. The Trabucchi fishing platforms at Peschici allow the fishermen to fill their nets without going to sea. An aerial view over Vieste with its historic center and eleventh century Cathedral shows the coast where golden beaches and marine caves once frequented by pirates and smugglers now lure tourists. Learn360

### Trulli Of Alberobello

6:15 min H 2009

The Trulli, conical stone roofs, of Alberobello are an Unesco Heritage Site. The town of Locorotondo encircles its Cathedral and is known for its wine production. The Lombard presence is evident in the thousand year old temple of Sepannibale with its high medieval paintings, and contact with Arab Sicily is preserved in the Arabian horses of the region. The coastal fortresses of Puglia became manor houses and now, tourist hotels. Learn360

### Magnificent Italia: SICILLIA

L113922, DO

Roman and Greek influences are present throughout the largest island in the Mediterranean. With a population of some five million inhabitants, the cities within the island are born and bred by the sea. Visit the port cities made famous by explorers and archaeological sites that depict the past of this great island.

### Agrigento

8 min H 2009

Inland from Agrigento organic vineyards produce grapes for the wineries. Novelist Leonardo Sciascia captured the spirit of Sicily and is honored here. At Agrigento, the Valley of the Temples has been awarded International Heritage Status while archeologists continue to uncover and preserve these ancient Greek monuments. We hear the verses of Sicilian poet, Salvatore Quasimodo. Learn360

### Layers of Civilizations

8:01 min H 2009

Despite the mafia stereotype, the successive presence of Phoenician, Roman, Arab, Norman, French and Spanish settlers has formed layers of cultures that invite the tourist to Sicily. At Marsala the remains of a Phoenician ship show the technical skill of Phoenician shipbuilders. Marsala wine and the traditional music and dance are celebrated. Learn360

### Mazaro del Vallo / Selinunte Acropolis

8:55 min H 2009

Mazara del Vallo on the southwestern coast is Sicily's most important fishing port with its Arab quarter, baroque buildings and thousand year old Cathedral built during different epochs. Selinunte was a 7th century BC Greek city and rival of Segesta. The ruins were rediscovered and the Greek Acropolis restored. Eraclea Minoa and Sciacca are reminders of the Greek and Roman past. Learn360

### Salt Pans And Windmills Of Mozia

6:32 min H 2009

Adjacent to Italy's largest unpolluted lagoon, salt pans flanked by windmills for grinding the salt remind one of the importance of this ancient industry to the Phoenician colony on the island of Mozia. The Whitaker Museum displays Greek and Phoenician art and artifacts. The paved road that once linked Mozia to the mainland is now submerged. Learn360

### The Traditional Sicilian Cart / Segesta

7:45 min H 2009

Inland we visit Calatafimi craftsmen as they construct and decorate the traditional Sicilian cart. We see the Roman theater and temple at Segesta and the covered ruins of Gibelina Vecchia, destroyed by an earthquake, and the rebuilt city of Gibelina Nuova. Learn360

### Trapani's Fishing Heritage

6:34 min H 2009

Trapani is the most Arabic of Italy's cities. We see the fish market, the Museum of Prehistory, the fortress lookout towers. Craftsmen create models of ancient ships. The guilds continue to preserve the 18th century wooden sculptures of the Passion of Christ in the Church of the Mysteries. The Shrine of the Patron Saint of Sailors has always attracted pilgrims to Erice. The old tuna fishery, Tonara di Bonagia, which reminds one of the importance of the Tuna Matanza, is now a tourist hotel. We see the marble quarries of Custonaci. Learn360

### Zingaro Nature Reserve / Castellammare

7:20 min H 2009

Following the coast we see the white sand beaches of San Vito Lo Capo and the cliffs of the Zingaro Nature Reserve where footpaths wander over the landscape of dwarf palms, cacti and erosion carved gorges. The old tuna fishery of Scopello borders azure waters.

### **Magnificent Italia: TRENTINO**

Take flight over the summits of the Dolomites, an inexhaustible reign of Alpine castles and fortresses of history and contemporary art. Follow in the footsteps of the pioneers of mountaineering where Italian and Germanic legends reverberate amongst the woods and valleys, torrents, impetuous cascades and placid lakes.

### **Ancient Sanctuary / Iron Sculpture**

3:49 min H 2009

We see the Sanctuary of San Romedio where six superimposed chapels date from the eleventh century. White river rafting is popular where iron forges worked the minerals mined in the area. Sculptor in iron, Luciano Zanoni, talks about his art which has won international acclaim. Learn360

### **The Brenta Peaks**

5:14 min H 2009

Famous mountain climber and alpine guide, Cesare Maestri, praises the Brenta Peaks, said to be witches turned to stone, and especially the difficult Crozzon di Brenta. We see the macabre frescoes on the facade of San Vigilio in the Genova Valley. Learn360

### **Lake Garda**

6:50 min H 2009

The Trentino craft of the knife grinder is celebrated. Canale maintains the aspect of a medieval village beside evidence of a pre-historic settlement. Riva di Garda hosts many water sports like wind surfing and championship regattas on the beautiful Lake Garda while free climbing is practiced on the lakeside cliffs. Learn360

### **Lakes And Castles Of The Non Valley**

4:29 min H 2009

At Lake Molveno we see the a functioning saw mill using only water power. A biologist discusses the phenomenon of Lake Tovel that turned red and dropped a meter in 1964. Castles surrounded by orchards and gardens dot the hills around Non Valley, like Castel Valer, Castel Nanno, Castel Thun, and Castello di Cles. Learn360

### **Mountain Myths**

7:36 min H 2009

The Coro Valsella sings of the legend of the Dolomites where myths are intertwined with reality. Extreme skier, Tony Valeruz, talks of his relationship with the highest peak, La Marmolada, since childhood. The murals that decorate the houses of Canazei tell stories in Italian and Ladin as witches on broomsticks fly above portals. Craftsmen carve masks for Carnival. Learn360

### **Rovereto / Giudicarie Valley**

7:06 min H 2009

Rovereto in the Giudicaria Valley was an important center for the Bishops of Trentino, but today hosts cultural events. Known as the Athens of Trentino, Rovereto's Museum of Contemporary Art is world famous. At the Castello di Avio, frescoes depict the history of a fourteenth century battle and stories of courtly love. The Castello di Beseno is the largest non-urban fortified complex of Trentino where a hundred kilometers of military roads and mountain bike trails invite cycling events. Learn360

### **Ski Jumping / Free Climbing**

4:11 min H 2009

We hear of the legend of roses transformed into the stone Dolomites. The ski jump center at Predazzo is an international training base. At Cavalese we see the frescoed rooms of the medieval Palazzo della Magnifica Comunità, a representation of medieval self-government. A free climber praises the appeal of the Dolomites. Learn360

### **Trento**

5:05 min H 2009

Trento is the elegant regional capital where we see frescoes in the fortress of Castello di Buonconsiglio and the Gothic Venetian church of Santa Maria Maggiore where the Council of Trent was held. The Cathedral with its bell tower, the Palazzo Pretorio and Fountain of Neptune add to the beauty of the city. The festival of the Patron Saint is celebrated with river barge races. Learn360

### **Vineyards And Lakes Of Sole Valley**

5:41 min H 2009

The area is known for its many lakes and vineyards, as well as the high alpine meadows where shepherds pasture their cattle in the summer. Cyclist Francesco Moser talks of working in the vineyards and discusses the many varieties of grapes. Learn360

He was expelled and went to Johannesburg where he encountered the misery and exploitation of his people while working as a policeman at the mines. He completed his degree by correspondence and joined the African National Congress party to protest the racism enshrined by law. Blacks needed a pass to move around, had no voting rights, and were forcibly removed from their lands by whites who owned 90% of the land. Learn360

As the treason trial wound down, Mandela and the others were acquitted and he became the symbol of the anti-Apartheid movement. As the ANC had

been declared an illegal organization, Mandela became resolved that peaceful resistance was futile. We hear his first TV interview. Mandela goes underground, using various disguises, and founds the MK, the ANC's armed wing of sabotage to take out areas of government infrastructure and destabilize the government, prompting withdrawal of foreign investment. Mandela and members of MK train outside the country. Learn360

### Peaceful Resistance

After WWII, conservatism and Afrikaner nationalism grew. Mandela, led the ANC Youth League in peaceful protests while obtaining his law degree. As South African industry expanded at the expense of the workers, trade unionists and the communist party were ferociously attacked by police. Mandela adhered to Mahatma Gandhi's call for peaceful resistance, but was jailed and restricted to Johannesburg. Mandela and Oliver Tambo founded the first Black law firm. Mandela was instrumental in the foundation of the multiracial Congress of the People and its Freedom Charter, while formulating an underground resistance movement. Learn360

### President de Klerk Frees Political Prisoners

Winnie Mandela fomented a militant mindset and encouraged the Mandela United Football Club to violence. The Rand was threatened and many South African whites were questioning Apartheid. When Botha suffered a stroke, Frederik W. de Klerk replaced him and unbanned all political parties and ordered all political prisoners released. In 1989 Walter Sisulu was released after 26 years in prison and on February 11, 1990, Nelson Mandela was released after 27 years. Both de Klerk and Mandela advocate for a peaceful and unified South Africa and a new constitution, but consensus was difficult. Learn360

### Prisoner At Robben Island

On Mandela's return to South Africa, he was arrested and charged under the Sabotage Act of 1962 which called for the death penalty. International media covered the trial and we hear his words in his defense. He is sentenced to life in Robben Island Prison where, as a political prisoner, he worked in the limestone quarry and continued his studies. After the assassination of Hendrik Verwoerd, John Vorster became President and implemented his predecessor's policies. Winnie Mandela became an activist and was routinely arrested, Mandela's son died in an accident and plots against Mandela were uncovered. Civil unrest and the Soweto riots prompted more public support and

international campaigns to free Mandela. Anti-Apartheid sentiment and international sanctions prompted the government to move Mandela to Cape Town and President P.W. Botha's offer of freedom in 1985. Learn360

### The Sharpeville Massacre

On March 21, 1960, police opened fire on a non-violent protest in Sharpeville against the pass system. Women and children were among the many wounded and dead. Strike actions followed and the government banned the PAC and the ANC parties. International criticism of the South-African government was widespread, joined by the British Prime Minister, Harold MacMillan, and labor leader Hugh Gaitskell, whose speech we hear. South Africa becomes a Republic and leaves the Commonwealth. Learn360

The Danube River travels 1700 miles through the heart of Europe from its start in the Black Forest in Germany, through Austria, Hungary, Yugoslavia, and Romania to the Black Sea. ### Linderhof Palace / Etal Monastery

Ludwig II built the Linderhof Palace, a small but extravagant attempt to reproduce the period of Louis XIV, the French Sun King. Near Linderhof Palace he built Hunding's Hut, copied from Wagner's opera, and the Venus Grotto. We visit the Etal Monastery with its Rococo style where the Benedictine monks distilled an Etal liqueur. In the nearby town of Etal in the Alpes we see a wood-carver's workshop. Learn360

### Neuschwanstein Castle

High above his childhood home, Ludwig built the Cinderella castle, Neuschwanstein, a monument to Romanticism and filled with scenes from the legends of Wagner's operas. He became a recluse, addicted to drugs for toothaches, spending freely from the treasury as he built and decorated more castles. Learn360

The most magnificent Renaissance jewel built by Francois I is the Chateau de Chambord with 440 rooms and a double staircase perhaps influenced by Leonardo di Vinci. A light and sound display on summer nights recounts the Chateau's history and famous residents, like Louis XIV. Learn360

### Chateau de Chenonceau

2:42 min MH 2002  
The Chateau of Chenonceau bridging the river Cher is called the ladies' chateau as it was built by Tomas Bohier but soon bought by Henri II for his mistress, Diane de Poitiers. After the king's death, his widow, Catherine de Medici, took the chateau from the mistress and it became a place of pleasure and intrigue for the royal court. Learn360

### King Francois I

2:53 min MH 2002  
Influenced by the Italian Renaissance, King Francois I was a prolific castle builder and patron of Leonardo di Vinci whose museum at Chateau Clos Luce and tomb we see near Amboise. Francois I influenced changes at the Chateau d'Amboise and the Chateau de Blois where we see the royal emblem, salamanders, repeated and the Renaissance style spiral staircase. Women became more prominent at the royal court where scientists, scholars and artists were appreciated. Learn360

### Langeais Castle

2:45 min MH 2002  
In 1434 Charles VII moved the royal court to the Langeais Castle in the Loire Valley, modifying the medieval castle for comfort and esthetics. The influence of the Italian Renaissance was felt after Charles VIII visited Italy and brought back scholars, architects and gardeners. Learn360

### The Loire River Valley

2:51 min MH 2002  
Since the 15th century, the Loire River Valley afforded the French royalty and court a tranquil site for the construction of Renaissance style palaces and gardens. Learn360

### Tours And Chateau di Villandry Gardens

In the city of Tours we see the Cathedral built in various styles from the 13th to the 16th centuries and famous for its stained glass windows. Tours also has France's second largest flower market, but the spectacular palace gardens at the Chateau di Villandry twelve miles west of Tours are not to be missed. Italian gardeners from 1536 created ornamental gardens of unique designs at Villandry, like the different kinds of love represented in the Garden of Love and the giant chessboard of the vegetable garden. ### Bonn / Fabled Forest And Dragon's Cave

It is known for the Ludwig von Beethoven Festival held in honor of its native son and for the Feast of St. Martin with its bonfires and costumes. The Seven Mountains National Park is a fabled forest where seven giants labored and the Seven Dwarfs hid Sleeping Beauty. Following the Drachenfelsbahn one can see the Drachenfels Castle and dragon's cave where Siegfried slayed the dragon. Learn360

### Cologne

4:26 min MH 2002  
The Rhine River crosses six European countries in its journey from the Swiss Alps to the North Sea. The northern city of Cologne was founded by the Romans in 33 BC. The Cathedral with its flying buttresses and stained glass windows is an example of the Gothic style of architecture. The Old Town of Cologne boasts the Museum Schnutgen for medieval art and the Museum Ludwig for modern art. Cologne is also known for its numerous beer taverns. Learn360

### Worms And The Romanesque

One of the oldest cities in Germany, Worms was also the seat of the Emperors of the Holy Roman Empire and the magnificent Cathedral harbors many emperors' tombs. At the Niebelungen Museum, the Nibelungen legend is retold. After Martin Luther's protests at the Assembly of Worms, he was excommunicated by the Emperor Charles V. The Cathedral at nearby Speyer is the best and largest example of Romanesque Cathedrals of the Middle Ages. Within the Cathedral, the original medieval Imperial Vault houses the tombs of Holy Roman Emperors. Learn360

### The Cyclades Island Group

The Cyclades are a Greek island group in the Aegean Sea. The hidden caves of Milos provided cover for pirates, but the island is most famous for the Greek statues found there, Poseidon and the Venus di Milo. ### Lesvos Island

3:05 min MH 2002  
Lesvos Island, closest to the Turkish mainland, is known for its olive oil, ancient petrified forest and as the birthplace of the Greek poet, Sappho. The modern author, Nikos Kazantzakis, speaks of the beauty and rich histories of ancient civilizations of Greece. Learn360

### Mykonos And Ios

### Christian Missionaries

The Bell Tower, famous as the Leaning Tower of Pisa, began its tilt soon after its construction in 1173 and native son, Galileo Galilei, supposedly conducted his experiments with gravity from the top. ### Siena

3 min MH 2002

Siena was untouched by the Renaissance due to the Bubonic plague of 1348 and conserves its medieval Gothic architecture. The Palio, a horserace of neighborhood rivalry, is celebrated twice a year in the center of town, the Piazza del Campo. The Palazzo Pubblico is now a museum where we see the Sala della Pace with its murals reminding the city council of good governance. Learn360

### Siena's Unique Duomo

2:53 min MH 2002

The exterior of Siena's Cathedral is unfinished as the plague devastated the city. However, the pink marble facade is ornately sculpted by Nicolo and Giovanni Pisano. The interior holds artistic treasures of the thirteenth century Gothic style such as the pulpit and stained glass windows, the oldest in Italy. A fifteenth century chapel is a tribute to Pope Pius II, an example of the Italian Renaissance in full bloom. Siena gives the visitor a view of Italy as it was before the Renaissance changed the world. Learn360

### Tuscany

2:39 min MH 2002

The Stendhal Syndrome warns the visitor to enjoy Tuscany at a leisurely pace to appreciate all it has to offer, from Siena's Palio Horserace, the art and culture of Florence that gave meaning to the word Renaissance, to the vineyards that produce the world famous Chianti. Learn360

### World Odysseys: Italy (Naples)

Following a winding coastal road, we reach Positano with its steep steps from the beach and cliffside villas. The terraced town of Ravello with its gardens of exotic plants overlooks the Bay of Salerno. Learn360

### Castles of The Conquerors

2:19 min MH 2002

The fifteenth century Egg Castle was the royal residence of Frederick of Aragon who massacred his plotting barons there. The Spanish built the Palazzo Reale, then the French built the Palazzo Capo di Monte, each new conqueror outdoing the rest. Learn360

### Fortunate Naples

4:06 min MH 2002

Naples, curving around the Amalfi Coast, has experienced centuries of western civilization. Visitors admire the spectacular landscapes, mild climate and zest for life of the locals. Romans enjoyed their holidays here, as well as modern writers and composers. Learn360

### Pompeii, Herculaneum, Ischia

1:59 min MH 2002

Mt. Vesuvius erupted in 79 AD covering Pompeii with volcanic ash and Herculaneum in layers of mud which are still being excavated after their discovery in the 1700's. We see mosaics and murals of these prosperous Roman cities. The Greeks first colonized Naples in 800 BC and settled on the Island of Ischia. Learn360

We see the Franciscan church, site of the tombs of the Doges and nobles and the Scuola Grande di San Rocco, filled with paintings and murals of Giacomo Tintoretto. Learn360

### Gondolas

Along the Gran Canal and under bridges, Gondolas are poled by the Gondolier. The Rialto is the main commercial district and its markets are reached by boat in the Gran Canal. We see craftsmen carefully constructing Gondolas. Palaces that line the canals are endangered by their sinking foundations and rising water levels. Learn360

### Lake Garda

Lake Garda is Italy's largest lake and the surrounding countryside is known for the wines produced by its vineyards. We see the Roman ruins of Sirmione. The sulfurous hot springs are still a popular resort on the peninsula. The Roman poet Catullus had a villa here. ### Murano/ Flood Gates

### Piazza San Marco

We see the Ca' Rezzonico Palace, now a museum, which was the home of a Venetian noble. The Church of Santa Maria della Salute with its famous dome was built in response to the Black Death plague in 1630. The Piazza San Marco is the center of Venetian life with its cafes and palaces. We see the Doges' Palace and visit Saint Mark's Basilica with its Byzantine influences such as the golden and enameled icons. Learn360

### Riva Resorts

Riva del Garda on the north-western corner of Lake Garda is known for the sports of windsurfing and sailing. The town of Limone was once known for its terraces and lemon trees, but today is a tourist destination with luxurious villas and gardens. Venice and the Veneto region leave an indelible impression on all visitors. Learn360

### Veneto Countryside/ Andrea

#### Palladio

Villas and farming estates dot the Veneto countryside which stretches from the Adriatic to Lake Garda. Agriculture has become more important in the Venetian economy. The great architect, Andrea Palladio, born in 1508, studied the ancient Roman ruins and recombined elements, like the use of columns, with modern functionality.
